Teaching methods:	Lectures, tutorials, seminars. There will be approximately 12 hours of lectures per week. There will also be tutorials and/or seminars.
Assessment methods:	Exams, assignments. Assessment takes a variety of forms. Usually there will be a combination of written exams and coursework.
	*****Please note that you will be required to attend all exams in person, there will be no alterative assessment methods****
Pass mark:	The pass mark at Cardiff is 40%
Average credits that students take per academic year:	FULL YEAR OF STUDY: 120 UK credits. The normal course load would be 6 modules (of 20 credits each) ONE SEMESTER OF STUDY: 60 UK credits. The normal course load would be 6 modules (of 10 credits each) 1 UK credit = 0.5 ECTs



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Academic Information	It is preferable for incoming exchange students to study modules in Cardiff Business School relating to Business, Management, Economics, Finance and Accounting. It is also possible for exchange students to take modules which are listed in the Exchange Student Module Catalogue. They can usually also take modules in the Centre for Lifelong Learning, Levels 5 or Level 6 as required by the partnership agreement with your university. Usually, 10 Cardiff credits can be taken from outside the Business School per semester. You must take 60 Cardiff credits to be qualified as a full-time student, this is required by law for your full-time student visa status.
Available modules	The Business School modules available for exchange students will be available and emailed to all exchange students early May. Subject to approval by the offering schools, students may also choose to study modules taught by other schools of the University. Results:	Cardiff Business School will provide transcripts for Autumn semester students after the official Exam Board meeting held in February and for full year and Spring semester students after the official Exam Board meeting at the end of July. Transcripts will be sent to the home university and to the individual student via email.

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Healthcare:

Council Tax	If you are studying at Cardiff Business School for less than 24 weeks, you will need to send Cardiff City Council a letter from your home university confirming that you are on a full time programme of study. You will also need a Council Tax letter from Cardiff University, confirming that your time studying here is part of a full time programme in your home country. You will need to manually request this letter from the University. Medical Healthcare	Exchange students studying in the UK for longer than six months are entitled to free medical healthcare under the NHS (National Health Service), which includes consulting a doctor/General Practitioner (GP) and most other GP services; the treatment in a hospital (both emergency and non-emergency treatment); and prescription medication. (Prescription medication is free in Wales but not throughout the UK). Please note that certain services (e.g.vaccinations, sickness notes) are chargeable. Exchange Students coming to Cardiff for less than six months are not entitled to free medical treatment and should take out health insurance. All exchange students must register with a GP (doctor) close to the university.
